

Inseam Blending at the Knee


BETA QUERY: Is your inseam nice and blendy or very bendy?


At ~13:50 in SP7 Wide Leg Pants Drafting pt 1,1 start drawing my inseam. At around 14:08,1 blend the angle where the crotch to knee line meets the knee to ankle line.

During fittings, I've occasionally had students observe that the inner knee is pulling. Yet I have not been able to get enough feedback to understand what is happening.

One theory I have is that this area wasn't blended/curved enough. Your inseam should create a smooth blended line without an obvious turn at the knee. If your inseam creates a sharp curve with a very distinct turn at the knee, this turn may become undesirably visible while wearing the garment.

During the blending step, feel free to add more fabric at the knee level to make the inseam line smoother.
